

Llenwi is an exciting Creu Conwy project that will be creating and installing destination signage that features large scale artwork across Conwy county. The project is led by local augmented reality artist, Livi Wilmore and traditional signwriter Tomos Jones - they will be collaborating and holding creative workshops so communities can inspire the artwork and final installations.

The areas that are the focus of the project are: Abergele, Colwyn Bay, Llandudno, Conwy and Llanrwst. As part of the research phase the artists are hoping to get to know each area in a slightly different way . . . that 's where you come in.

We need help gathering stories, sayings, phrases, memories, pictures, and anything else about your area. There is no restriction on what could be gathered, or how it is presented. Share your own stories (they could be funny, silly or sad), memories, sayings, or ask a friend/relative/neighbour / member of the community.

As part of our project we will be experimenting with creating "mini 3D worlds" out of your panorama photos. We want to see "your world", maybe a room you feel at peace in, or a spot on your favourite bench- your own personal place of peace within Conwy county.

If you have a smartphone, you will be able to capture a panoramic photo inside your camera app, by pressing capture on "pano" mode and slowly moving your camera right to scan the desired area. If you have a traditional camera, you can take two or more photos that line up together, and then search for "online panorama stitcher" - there are many viable options!
