

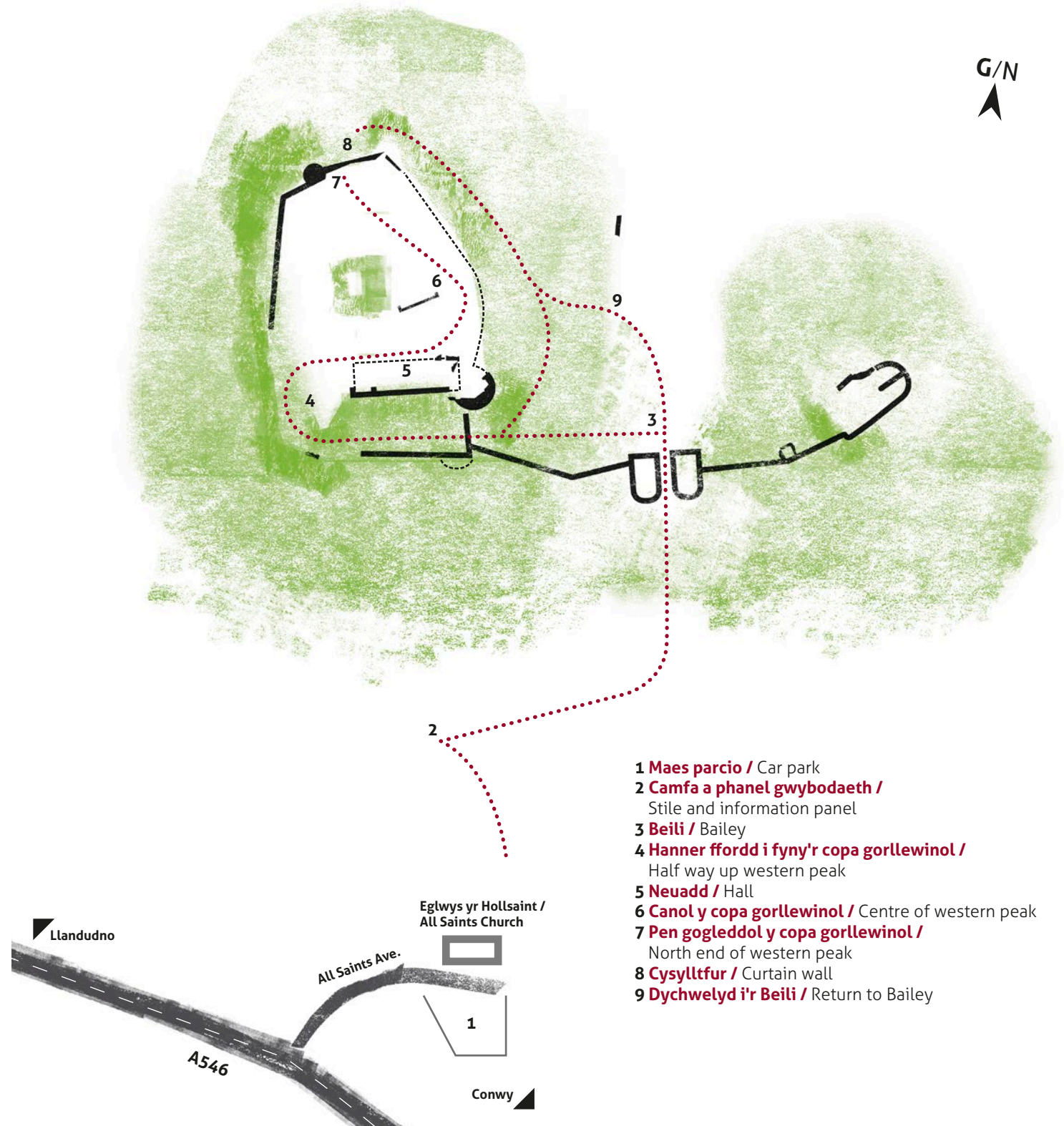
Castell Deganwy Deganwy Castle

Mae gan Castell Deganwy hanes tanllyd sy'n ymestyn yn ôl i'r 6ed ganrif o leiaf pan roedd yn sedd i'r rheolwr grymus Maelgwn Gwynedd. Yn 812, llosgodd y castell ar ôl i fellt ei daro. Ddeng mlynedd yn ddiweddarach, cafodd ei ddinistrio gan ymosodwyr Sacsonaidd. Yn ystod y canrifoedd a'i ailadeiladu sawl gwaith wrth i luoedd o Gymru a Lloegr frwydro i gael rheolaeth ar yr ardal. Cafodd y castell ei ailadeiladu am y tro olaf rhwng 1245 a 1250 gan Frenin Harri III a sefydlodd dref fyrhoedlog nesaf ato. Mae'r fan hon yn wych i fynd am daith gerdded gyda golygfeydd llawn ysbrydoliaeth dros Gonwy a mynyddoedd Eryri.

Deganwy Castle has a volatile history stretching back to at least the 6th century when it was seat of King Maelgwn Gwynedd. In 812, the castle burnt down after being struck by lightning. Ten years later it was destroyed by Saxon invaders. During the following centuries it was modified, damaged and rebuilt many times as Welsh and English forces battled for control of the area. The castle was rebuilt for the last time between 1245 and 1250 by King Henry III who established a short-lived town next to it. This spot is great for a walk with inspiring views over Conwy and Snowdonia.
